Zimbabwe

- Growing water scarcity and pollution
- Low-resource environment
- Partial decentralization
- Community-based management
- NGO saturation
- Colonial legacy



Project aims



- To investigate the multi-level structure and dynamics of information flows and decision-making in the rural water sector of Malawi
- To co-develop strategies to improve hydrosocial governance at catchment level



Approach




Hydro Nation Scholars Programme

1. Build historical context and narrative of formal and informal water institutions

2. Map policy vs. practice of water institutions via social network analysis

3. Understand informal catchment level decision-making processes and values


4. Co-develop strategies to improve multi-level governance



1. Stakeholder roles are not clear in policies/acts






2. Sector structure has implications for decision-making









Zoom in: District level
